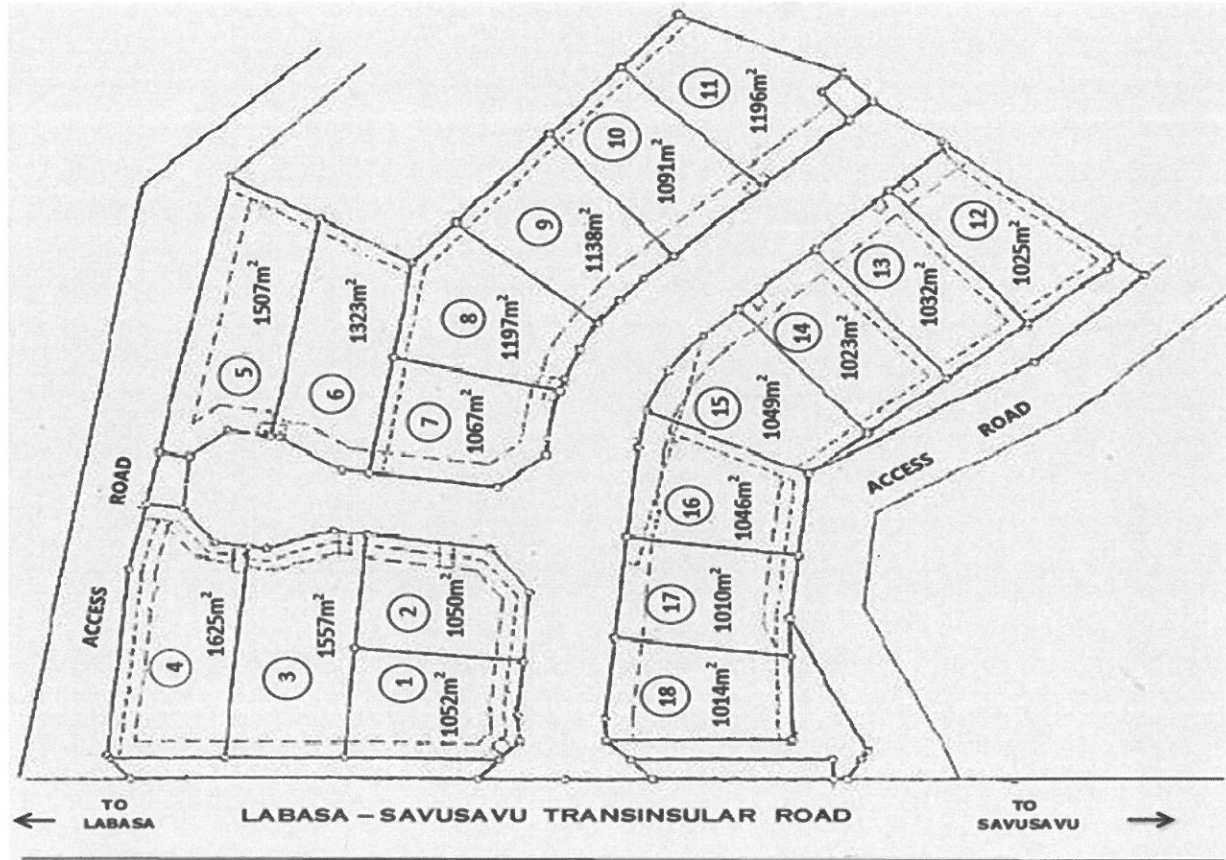


GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF FIJI

EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST FOR INVESTMENT OPPORTUNITY IN THE SAVUSAVU INDUSTRIAL ZONE

The Fijian Government invites expressions of interest from potential investors to acquire vacant lots located at the Savusavu Industrial Zone ("SIZ").



This is a rare opportunity to enter into a 99-year lease for one or more of the 18 vacant lots (total land area amounting to 5.19 acres) located along the Labasa-Savusavu Transinsular Road.

The location provides an ideal opportunity for developing various commercial and industrial operations with the SIZ being surrounded by commercial developments including Copra Millers of Fiji Limited and timber companies and is only 3 kilometres from Savusavu Town.

Water, power, sewerage and telecommunications services are available at SIZ and all roads in the area are sealed and curbed with footpaths. Regular public transport services are also available along the Labasa-Savusavu Transinsular Road.

Written submissions should detail long-term plans to develop the vacant lots into a productive and economic hub for the Savusavu Industrial Zone. The successful bidders will enter into a 99-year lease.
